

National Family Medicine Residency Sample Curriculum

Rotations in **BOLD** are hospital based.

Rotations in *italics* may be outpatient, but will need hospital access

Year 1

Internal Medicine (or FM service) 8 weeks

Critical Care (or IM, including ICU) 4 weeks – *½ day/week continuity clinic*

Emergency Medicine 4 weeks - *½ day/week continuity clinic*

OB/GYN 4 weeks - ½ day/week continuity clinic

Pediatrics 4 weeks - ambulatory

General Surgery 4 weeks – need inpatient & OR experience

Ophthalmology and ENT 2 weeks each

Community Oriented Primary Care* 12 weeks

Elective+/vacation 4 weeks (2 weeks vacation)

Elective+/vacation 4 weeks (1 week vacation)

Year 2

Internal Medicine (or FM service) 8 weeks

Emergency Medicine 4 weeks – *½ day/week continuity clinic*

OB/GYN 4 weeks - ½ day/week continuity clinic

Pediatrics 4 weeks – inpatient

Orthopedics 4 weeks

Urology 2 weeks

Dermatology 2 weeks

Community Oriented Primary Care* 12 weeks

Elective+ 8 weeks

Vacation/CME conference 4 weeks (3 weeks vacation/1 week CME)

Year 3

Internal Medicine (or FM service) 8 weeks

GYN 4 weeks

Pediatrics 4 weeks – ambulatory

Pediatric ER 4 weeks

Internal medicine (selective) 4 weeks

Sports Medicine 4 weeks

Community oriented primary care* 12 weeks

Elective+ 8 weeks

Vacation/conference 4 weeks (3 weeks vacation/1 week CME)

Didactics will include 5 scheduled hours per week, with 3 hours delivered via distance learning, including live lectures, facilitated podcasts, case presentations, journal club, and board review sessions. Two hours per week will occur at each site, including lectures, directed readings and self-study assignments.

Continuity Clinic Hours (except in specified rotations):

Years 1, 2 3 half days/week

Year 3 4 half days/week

+Electives may include:

- a. Allergy and immunology
- b. Cardiology
- c. Dermatology
- d. Endocrinology
- e. Gastroenterology
- f. Hematology
- g. Infectious diseases
- h. Nephrology
- i. Neurology
- j. Oncology
- k. Pulmonology
- l. Rheumatology
- m. Others as local resources allow

NOTE: Residents need exposure to each of the above disciplines in the course of their training.

*Community oriented primary care must include:

- 100 hours of geriatrics – which may be met by home care, nursing home visits, or
- others.
- Must have behavioral health component
- Must also include 100 hours of health systems management.
- Remainder of time may include continuity clinic, public health, or other options as
- specified by the CHC.
