

National Family Medicine Residency Curriculum Overview

Rotations in **BOLD** are hospital based. Rotations in *italics* may be outpatient, but will need hospital access

Year 1

Adult Inpatient Medicine 8 weeks – at least ½ day/week continuity clinic **4 weeks -** ½ day/week continuity clinic Critical Care (or IM, including ICU) **Emergency Medicine 4 weeks -** ½ day/week continuity clinic OB/GYN 4 weeks - ½ day/week continuity clinic **Pediatrics Ambulatory** 4 weeks General Surgery 4 weeks - need inpatient & OR experience **Ophthalmology** 2 weeks **ENT** 2 weeks Community Oriented Primary Care 12 weeks Site Selective 4 weeks Elective 4 weeks

Year 2

Year 3

Continuity Clinic Hours (except in specified rotations):

PGY-1, PGY-2 3 half days/week PGY-3 4 half days/week

Didactics will include at least 4 scheduled hours per week, with 1.5 hours delivered nationally via distance learning, including live lectures, facilitated podcasts, case presentations, and journal club. The other 2.5 hours per week will occur locally at each training location, including lectures, directed readings, board review, hands-on workshops, and self-study assignments.

Available elective rotations vary by training location.

The unique consortium model of the program allows residents the opportunity to participate in a cross-site rotation experience for one of their elective rotations in PGY-2 or PGY-3. Cross-site electives and the training location at which they occur are listed below.

- Advocacy in Washington, DC
- Correctional Medicine in Washington, DC
- Medical Assisted Treatment in Auburn, WA
- Refugee Health in Auburn, WA

Residents are allowed a total of 20 PTO days (paid time off) each academic year. In addition, each academic year PGY-2 and PGY-3 residents are allowed 5 days off from their usual duties to participate in self-directed learning (external CME-type activities) with prior approval.
