- Our whole-person primary health services include integrated medical, dental, and behavioral health, addiction and recovery, and Ryan White HIV services.
- Our growing network of community health centers in Lackawanna, Luzerne, Wayne, and Wyoming counties treated more than 38,000 patients in Fiscal Year 2025.
- Our 13 community health centers do not turn away patients due to a lack of insurance or an inability to pay. For individuals who qualify based on family size and income, our health centers offer a sliding-fee discount program to ensure health care is affordable for everyone.

- Our Teaching Health Center Graduate Medical Education Consortium is one of the largest in the nation funded by the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration, featuring more than 170 physicians in training annually. To date, more than 1,100 medical residents and fellows have graduated from our residency and fellowship programs.
- Our residency training programs feature four disciplines – Internal Medicine, Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, Family Medicine, and the Internal Medicine-Geriatrics Integrated Pathway. Our fellowship training programs includes cardiovascular disease, gastroenterology, and geriatrics.
- Our physicians train in our primary and preventive care centers in Northeastern and Eastern Pennsylvania, as well as in community-based settings in Arizona, Ohio, Washington, and Washington, D.C.
